PROPOSED PROJECT

Project	Drainage and Roadway Improvements – CR 676, CR 6767, CR 6768, and CR 6769
Location	County Roads 676, 6767, 6768, and 6769, Liberty County, Texas (outside Dayton city limits)
Estimated Total Cost	\$5,250,000
CDBG-DR Funds Requested	\$5,000,000
Local Leverage	\$250,000

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Liberty County proposes drainage and roadway improvements along County Roads 676, 6767, 6768, and 6769, located outside the Dayton city limits. These roadways serve a rural residential community that experienced flooding and water damage during the 2024 disaster events. CR 676 serves as the primary access route for the entire community to SH 321, and CR 6768 and CR 6769 provide direct access to the more densely situated residential properties in the area.

The proposed improvements total approximately 21,850 linear feet and include:

- Drainage improvements to bar-ditches and culverts along CR 676 (12,120 LF), CR 6767 (430 LF), CR 6768 (4,650 LF), and CR 6769 (4,650 LF)
- Roadway mill and overlay, or complete reconstruction as warranted

WHO MAY BE EXPECTED TO BENEFIT

All residents with properties fronting or served by CR 676, CR 6767, CR 6768, and CR 6769 in Liberty County will benefit from the proposed improvements. The service area is primarily residential in character. Benefits are available to all residents within the service area and are not limited to any specific group or subgroup.

Estimated Total Beneficiaries: Approximately 650-700 residents

TIMING AND PRIORITIZATION OF BENEFITS

All residents within the project service area will receive benefits simultaneously upon completion of construction. No prioritization among residents, properties, or road segments is anticipated. Benefits are not phased — the drainage and roadway improvements are designed to function as a single integrated system serving the entire community. Liberty County intends to submit its application to the GLO by June 12, 2026. Upon award and contract execution, construction is anticipated to begin within six months, with completion expected within 30 months of contract execution, subject to GLO approval and federal procurement requirements.

AMOUNT AND PROPORTION OF BENEFITS

One hundred percent (100%) of all proposed CDBG-DR funds will be directed toward infrastructure improvements that directly benefit the identified residential service area. No funds will be applied to activities outside the project service area.

HOW TO SUBMIT COMMENTS

Written comments on the proposed project are invited during the posting period. Any comments received must be submitted with the final application to the GLO, along with Liberty County's written response to each comment. Comments may impact the proposed project and final application.
